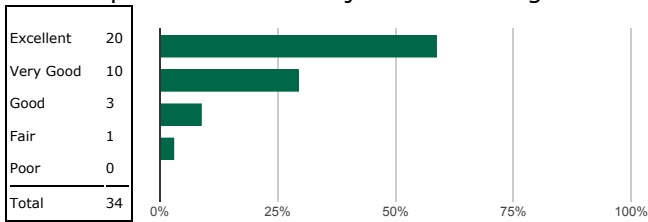

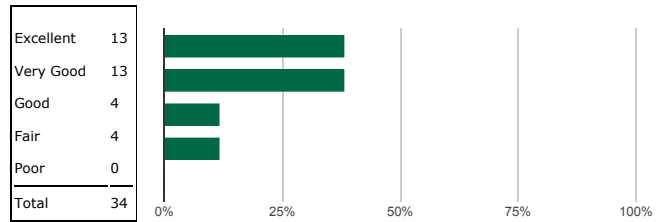

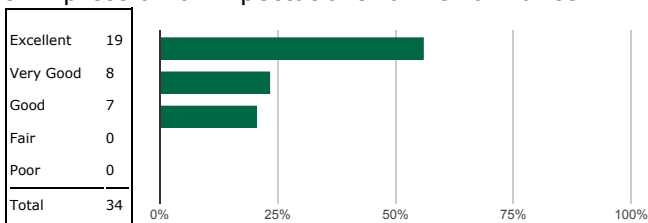

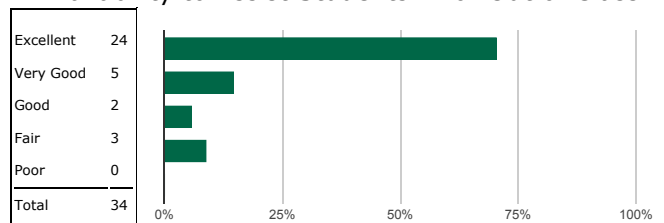

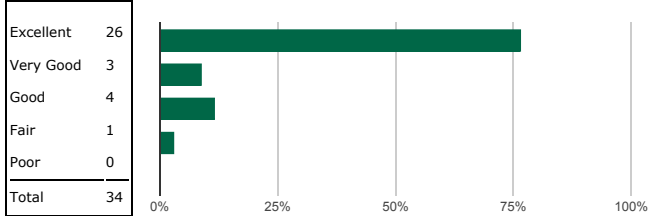

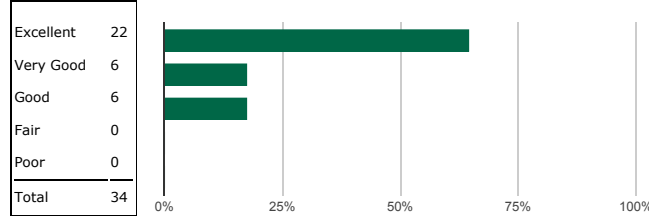

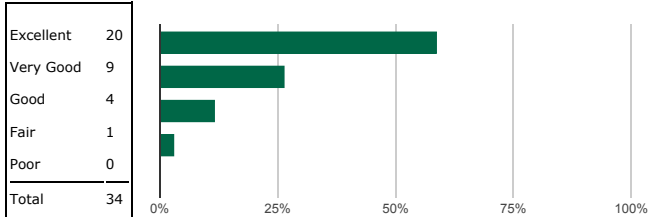

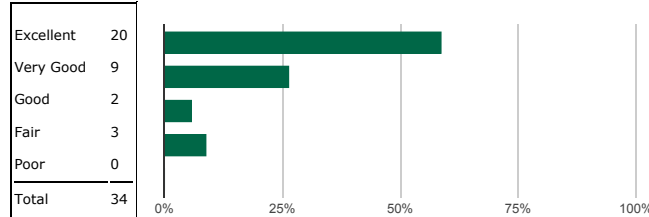

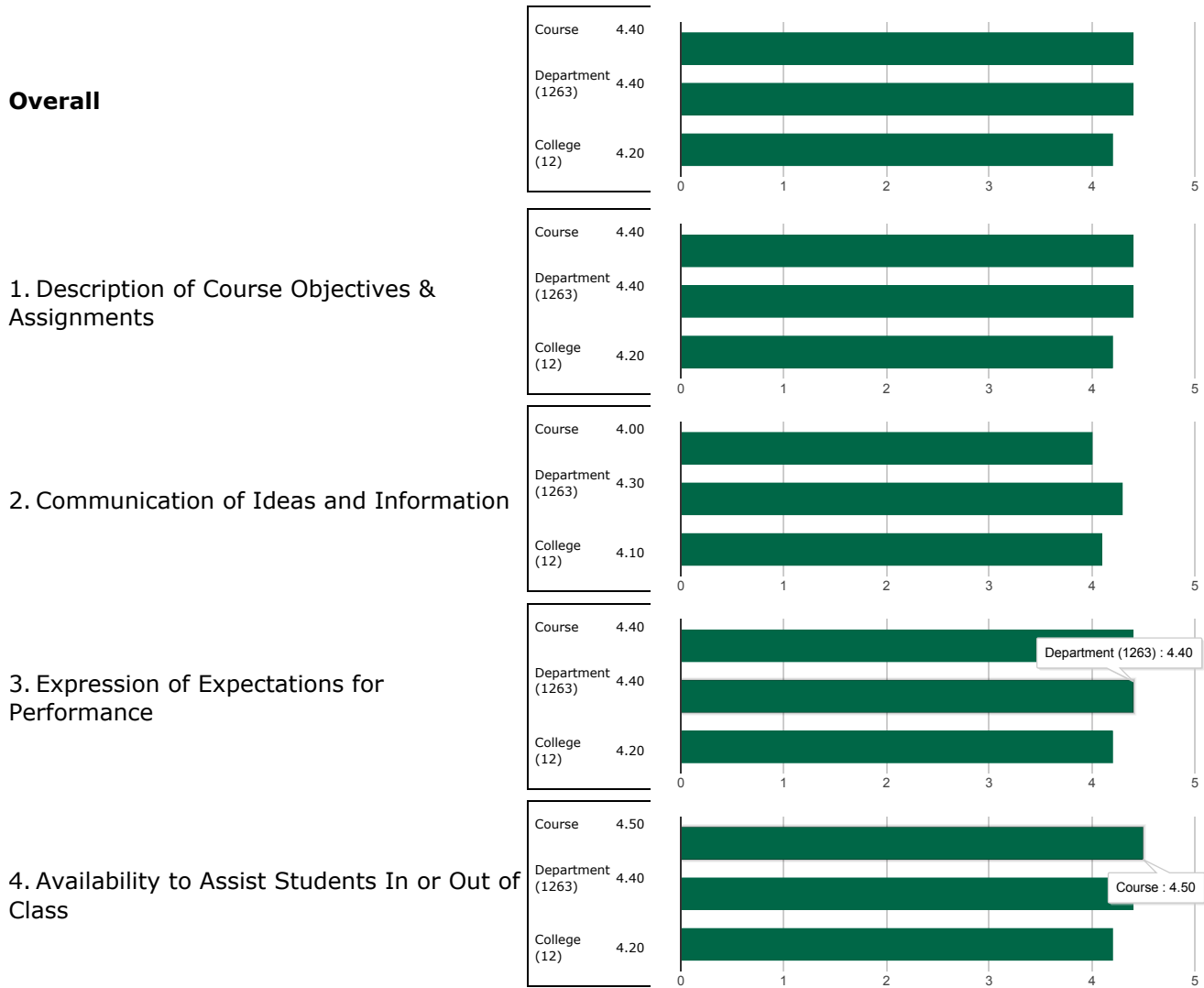

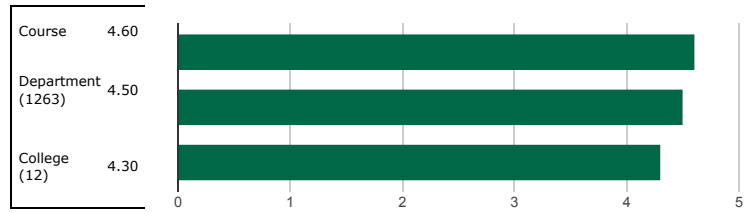

The charts below compare how the students in your course rated you as compared to all of the instructors in the department, and all of the instructors in the college.

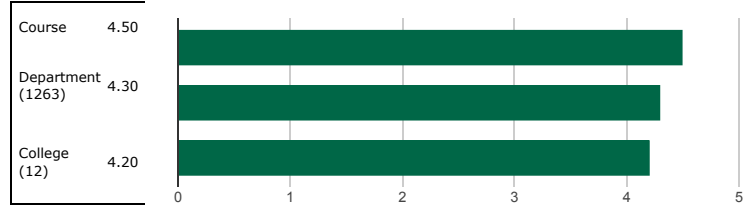

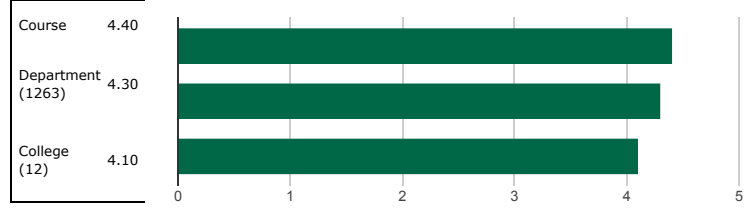

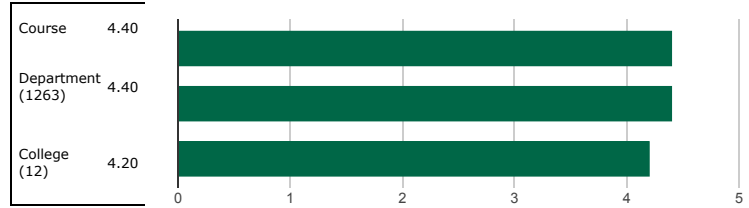
